## December Field Day: Forget Me Not Farm

On Wednesday December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2005, our 10 students from Summerfield Waldorf, Geyserville, and Windsor High Schools showed tremendous spirit and teamwork, leaving behind a legacy for an important therapeutic garden that serves children receiving assistance through the child protective services.



The goal of the day was to construct permanent raised beds, and fill garden boxes. Demonstrating sustainability in action, this was a "re-use" project. Our raised beds were constructed from recycled wood donated by Slakey Brothers, and the boxes were donated by Sonoma- Cutrer Vineyards.

The field day was a continuation of an earlier volunteer effort where FARMS students filled garden boxes, and trenched and installed a drip irrigation system. Funding for the project was made possible through a grant from **Western Growers**. Summerfield Waldorf students have adopted the project as a Community Action Project for the FARMS program, and will continue to volunteer their time for the final remaining tasks.
