Join us for a tour and talk on roadwork in progress in the Upper Mark West Creek watershed, and to learn more about partnership approaches to rural road maintenance located in high quality salmon and steelhead streams. John Green and staff from Pacific Watershed Associates will provide the general overview and project specific information.

Rural Roads maintained properly, with fish and wildlife in mind:

- Reduce or cut-off sediment delivery to creeks
- Have surface features that prohibit an accumulation of storm runoff.
- Replace undersized culverts with ones able to handle the 100 year storm, avoiding culvert failure and plugging
- Install culverts at stream grade, reducing cascading at the outfall of the culvert
- Reduce long-term costs for annual maintenance, from washout to mass failure.
